PUBLIC MEETING ITEM

The Town of Renfrew has prepared a new draft Comprehensive Zoning By-Law for the Town under Section 34 of the Planning Act to regulate the use of all lands, buildings and structures, within the entire Town of Renfrew. The New Zoning By-Law will replace the existing Comprehensive Zoning By-Law that was adopted in 1990 (B/L No. 55-90).


Her Worship Mayor Sandi Heins opened the public meeting and provided a welcome to those in attendance and gave a brief introduction.

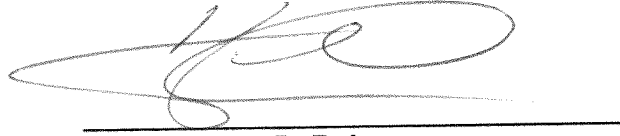
Julie Stewart McAdoo, Town Planner, described the public meeting process and explained the provision of notice pursuant to the Planning Act. She noted that all comments received to date, including those made during the May 27th, 2010 Open House, have been compiled and will be taken into consideration.

Charles Chessman, Acting Director of Development & Property for the County of Renfrew, explained the purpose of a Comprehensive Zoning By-Law and how it functions as an instrumental document in helping to guide development within the Town of Renfrew. Mr. Chessman described the process taken in putting together this draft document and highlighted many of the important sections. He also touched on the Provincial Policy Statement and the Town of Renfrew's Official Plan and how these documents, along with the Comprehensive Zoning By-Law, guide the municipal planning process.

Several comments and questions were raised by members of the general public in attendance and have been summarized in the notes of Anne McVean attached hereto.
