

Curbside Pickup

- Waste collection calendars are available at the Town Hall.
- Collection day can be viewed on the waste collection area map at <http://www.renfrew.ca/garbage-recycling.cfm>
- Place garbage and recycling at the curbside by 7 am on the day of collection.
- During winter months, please do not place bags, containers or recycling bins behind, on top or in the side of snow banks.
- Garbage bags/containers, recycling bins and leaf and yard waste bags/ bundles must not exceed 23 kg (50 lbs) each.

Garbage

- Two (2) bag limit per residential unit.
- Four (4) bag limit per commercial unit.
- Additional bag tags can be purchased for \$2.00 each at the Town Hall, Renfrew Landfill, Renfrew Library and Recreation Centre.
- Maximum bag size: 26" x 32".
- Maximum container size: 67 Litres.

Leaf and Yard Waste

- Place leaf and yard waste at the curbside before 7 am on Monday of leaf and yard waste week and leave at curbside until picked up. See waste collection calendar.
- Acceptable leaf and yard waste containers include: biodegradable paper bags and bound bundles.
- Individual branches must not exceed 25 mm (1 inch) in diameter. Bundled brush and twigs must not exceed 1.5 m (5 feet) in length and 0.6 m (2 feet) in diameter.

Composting

- Residents are encouraged to setup a backyard composter as composting can reduce garbage by 50%.
- A one-time composter credit of \$30.00 is available per property for residents that purchase and install a composter. To obtain the credit, a proof of purchase will be required.

Recycling

- Recycling containers size: 24" x 16" x 14" (70 Litres)
- Blue Boxes can be purchased for \$10.00 at Town Hall, Renfrew Landfill and Renfrew Municipal Garage.
- Recyclables must be sorted into the appropriate blue box.

Fibre Recycling Box (no milk or juice cartons)

- Newspapers, magazines, catalogues, flyers, brown paper bags
- Boxboard/ paperboard: cereal boxes, tissue boxes, paper egg cartons, toilet paper rolls, paper towel rolls and etc.
- Paper: writing and computer paper
- Cardboard

Comingled Recycling Box

- Aluminum: cans, pie plates, trays and foil wrap
- Glass: Clear and coloured glass food and beverage bottles, jars (must be cleaned and rinsed)
- Cartons: milk and juice cartons and tetra paks
- Plastic: Type #1 to 7 food and beverage containers, tubs and lids
- Plastic film: bundle of grocery and shopping bags, outer wrap from cases of water, toilet paper and paper towels
- Tin: cans, open & empty paint cans (no plastic with metal tops or bottoms and empty aerosol cans)
- **Styrofoam: no longer accepted**

The Renfrew Landfill is only open to residents of the Town of Renfrew. Proof of residence is required.

Fees

Free Disposal

- Recycling Materials
- Scrap Metal
- Household Hazardous Waste
- Leaf and Yard Waste
- Branches and Brush (up to 2" in diameter)
- Christmas Trees
- Refrigeration Appliances (with ODP Sticker showing that the Freon has been removed)

Tipping Fees

- Household Garbage bags: \$2.00 each
- Waste under 200kg: \$15.00
- 200kg and over: \$80.00/ tonne
- Unsorted waste: \$150.00/ tonne
- Freon Removal: \$20.00

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

- The Household Hazardous Waste depot is located at the Renfrew Landfill
- HHW can be dropped off from May 6th to August 26th
- Acceptable Household Hazardous Waste materials:
 - Paints: All types of paint including aerosol containers, stains, coatings, driveway sealers, roof coatings and non pesticide marine coatings
 - Solvents: Turpentine, disinfectants, household cleaners, bleach, oven and drain cleaners, furniture stripper, ammonia, etc.
 - Fertilizers and pesticides: Herbicides, pesticides and insecticides, weed killer, etc.
 - Aerosol can products
 - Florescent tubes and compact florescent bulbs
 - Pool Cleaners
 - Pressurized cylinders: Propane, oxygen, helium, acetylene tanks and fire extinguisher etc.
 - Used oil, oil filters and brake fluid
 - Batteries: small home and automotive batteries
 - Gasoline
 - Anti-Freeze



Electronic Waste (E-Waste)

- Televisions, computers, monitors, computer peripherals, printers, scanners, telephones, mp3 players, cameras, radios, speakers, receivers, DVD players, video recorders and other electronic devices can be disposed of free of charge at the Renfrew Landfill.



Tires

- Tires without rims can be disposed of free of charge at the Renfrew Landfill.



Batteries and Cell Phones

- Household batteries weighing less than 11lbs (5 kg) and cell phones can be disposed of free of charge.
- Drop off Boxes are located at the Renfrew Landfill, Town Hall, Renfrew Library and Ma-Te-way Activity Centre.



Other HHW Locations

- Canadian Tire: waste oil, oil filters, antifreeze, empty oil containers, antifreeze containers, car batteries, cellphones, rechargeable and alkaline/ single-use batteries.
- Rona Home Centre: fluorescent tubes (4ft or less), fluorescent bulbs, latex, oil (alkyd), enamel or other paints, metal or anti-rust paints, aluminum paint, stains, varnish, urethane, spray paint cans, wood preservative and masonry paint.
- The Source: cellphones, rechargeable and alkaline/ single-use batteries.
- Aikenheads Drug Store: pharmaceuticals and syringes
- Drugstore Pharmacy (No Frills): pharmaceuticals and syringes
- Rexall Pharmacy: pharmaceuticals and syringes
- Walmart Pharmacy: pharmaceuticals and syringes

NOTE:

- Paint products must be in original container.
- Syringes brought back to these locations must be stored in approved bio-hazardous containers.
